And he himself gave some men as apostles, and some as prophets, and others as pastors and teachers, in order to perfect the saints for a work of

ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the deep knowledge of the Son of God, to perfect manhood, to the mature measure of the fullness of Christ.
